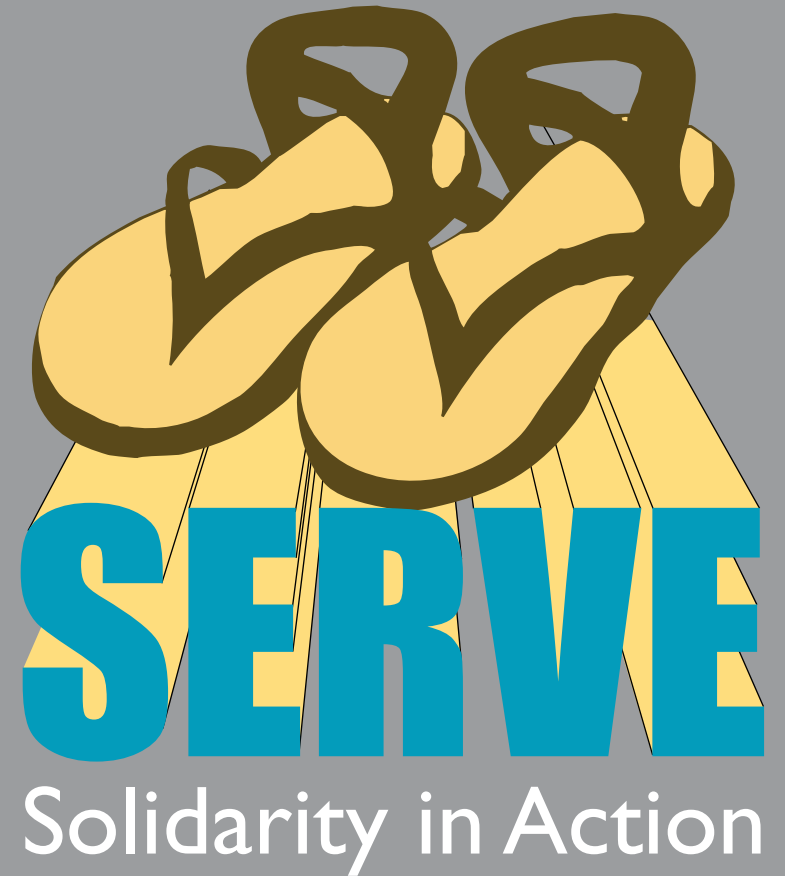
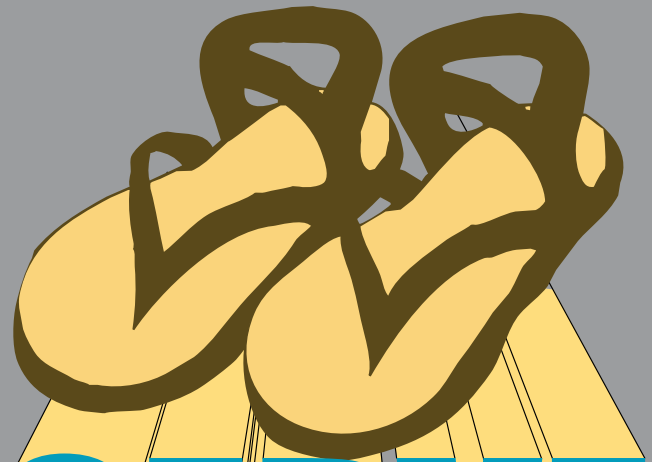

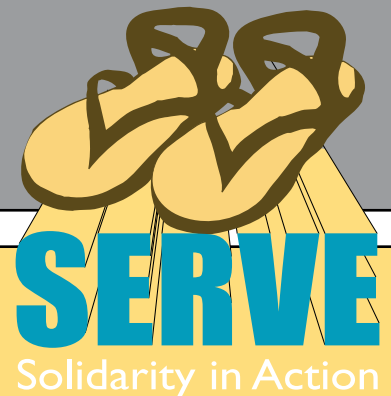
SERVE has committed itself to helping two different partners in Haiti

The Redemptorists themselves are homeless and now sleeping in gardens and on the footpaths outside their old houses. Over 40% of the local community are now homeless and living on the street or tents. The local school run by the Redemptorists is called Saint Gerard's and it was destroyed crushing the lives of over three hundred children.

At Tabarre, on the outskirts of Port-au-Prince and close to the American Embassy, Our Little Brothers and Sisters have a paediatric hospital called St. Damien's which is engaged in emergency programmes in response to the earthquake disaster. While the earthquake inflicted damage to St. Damien's Paediatric hospital at Tabarre, for example, the perimeter walls fell, a tower fell, but the hospital itself remained reasonably free from earthquake damage.

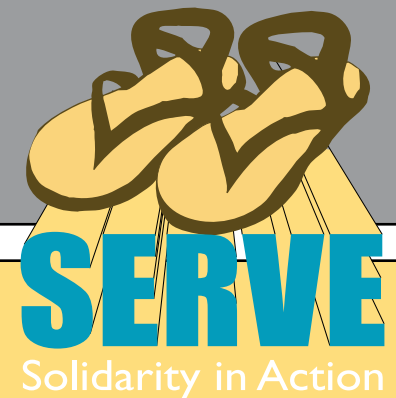
