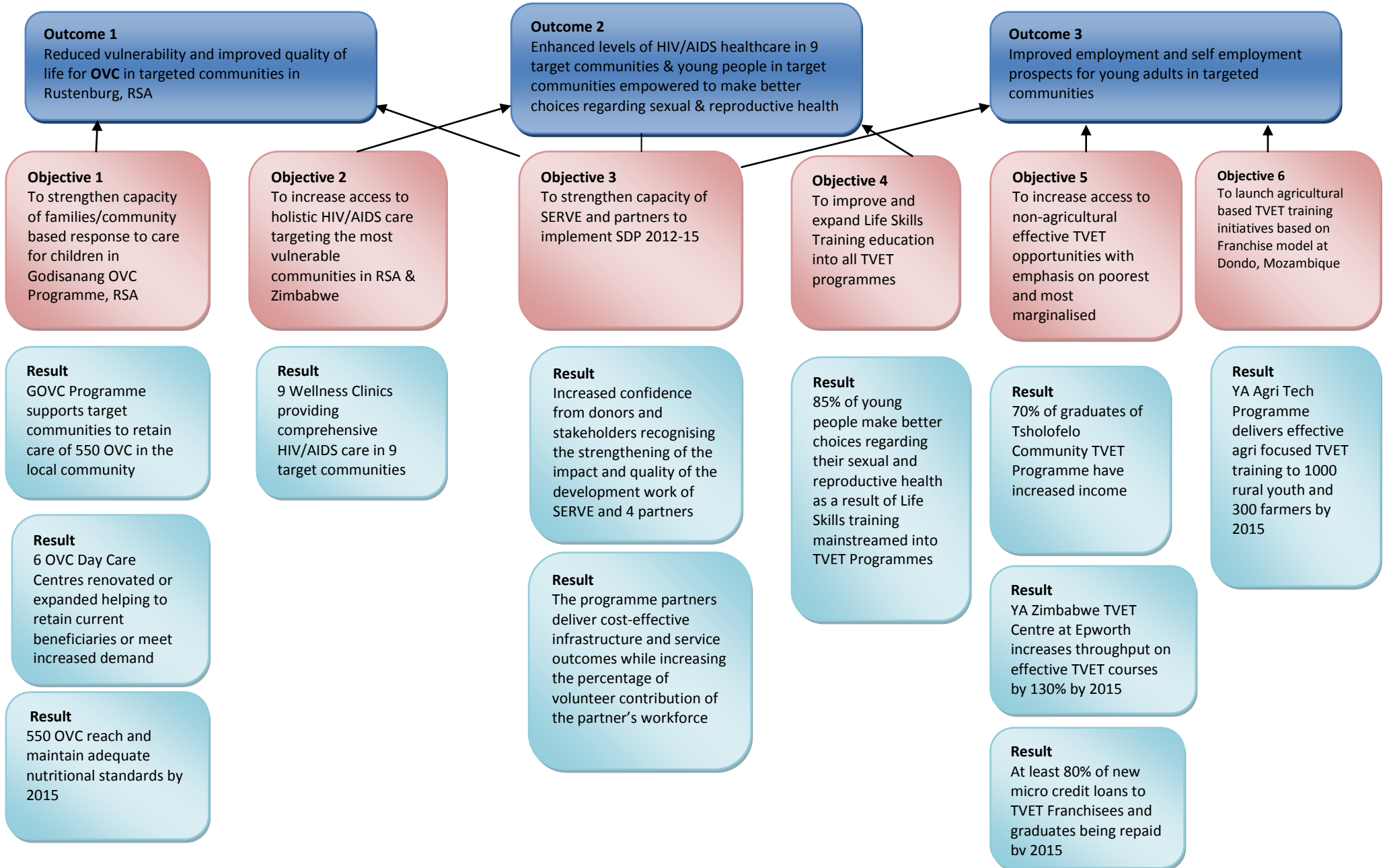


SERVE SDP LOGIC MODEL 2012-2015

Goal: Reduce vulnerability and improve Livelihood Security for poor children, young people, women and men in targeted communities in South Africa, Mozambique and Zimbabwe



Result

Evidence based research available to promote replication of GOVC intervention model

Result

The programme contributes to increased social capital, social cohesion, personal development and empowerment

Result

Improved sustainability and effectiveness of Franchise Model at YA TVET Centres in

Outputs

1. At least 17 CCW working on GOVC Programme, contributing approx 100,000 interventions annually
2. Average of 2,200 food & nutrition interventions made each month annually
3. Improved physical infrastructure at Daycare Centres for GOVC Programme
4. One research paper completed

Outputs

1. Renovated and newly constructed Wellness Clinics in 9 squatter camps in Rustenburg, RSA

Outputs

1. Volunteer Programme recruits, trains and assigns approx 40 volunteers a year to programme partners
2. Strengthened governance, management for results & M & E systems
3. Enhanced social capital and social cohesion in target communities

Outputs

1. Life skills training programmes implemented in 4 TVET Programmes and accessed by 3,000 young people each year
2. Training on SERVE'S manualised youth leadership training programme (GYTP) with 3 partners.

Outputs

1. At least 70 young people each year graduating from Tsholofelo Community TVET Programme in Rustenburg, RSA
2. Large extension to YA Zimbabwe Epworth TVET Centre completed
3. Approx 150 young people/franchise holders receive micro credit support over programme period in Mozambique and Zimbabwe
4. Training equipment upgraded at TVET Centres in Beira, Moz
5. Successful recruitment of Entrepreneurship Promoter at YA Mozambique

Outputs

1. Construction phases and instalment of utility services completed at YA Agri Tech, Dondo
