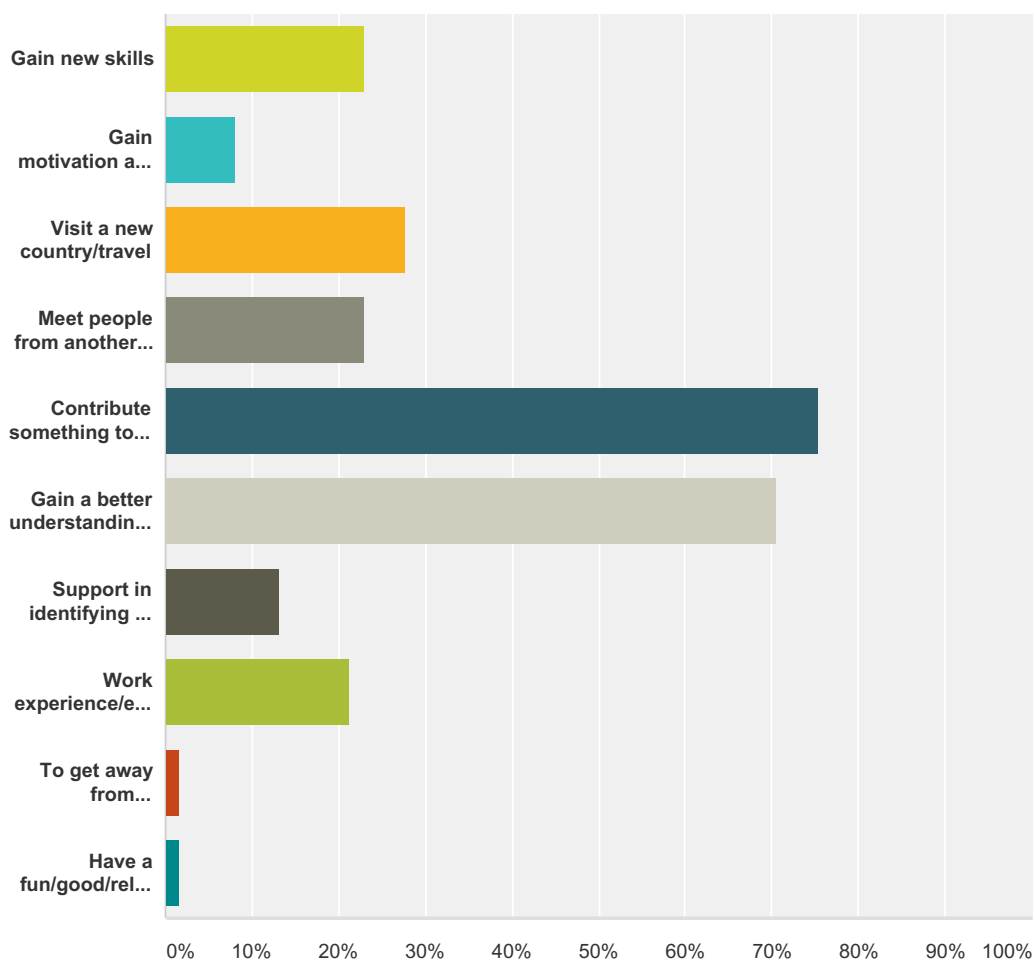

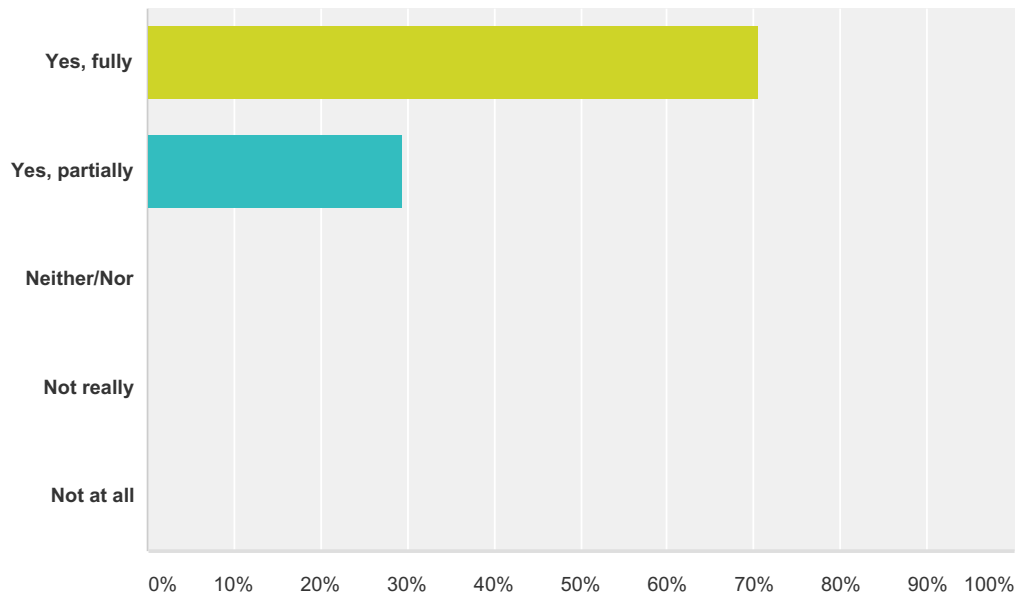

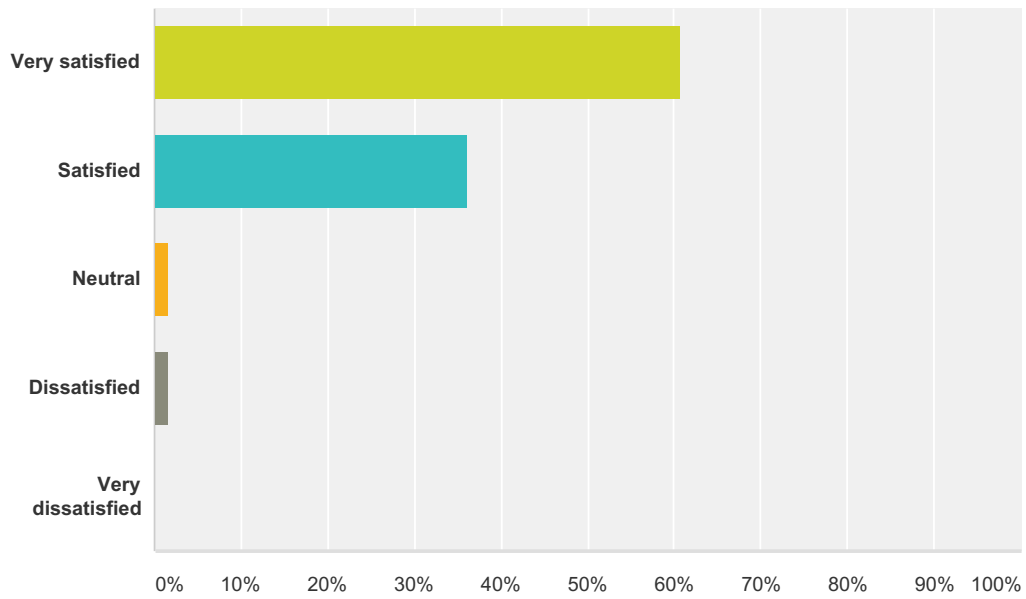

Q7 How satisfied were you with your overall experience of SERVE?

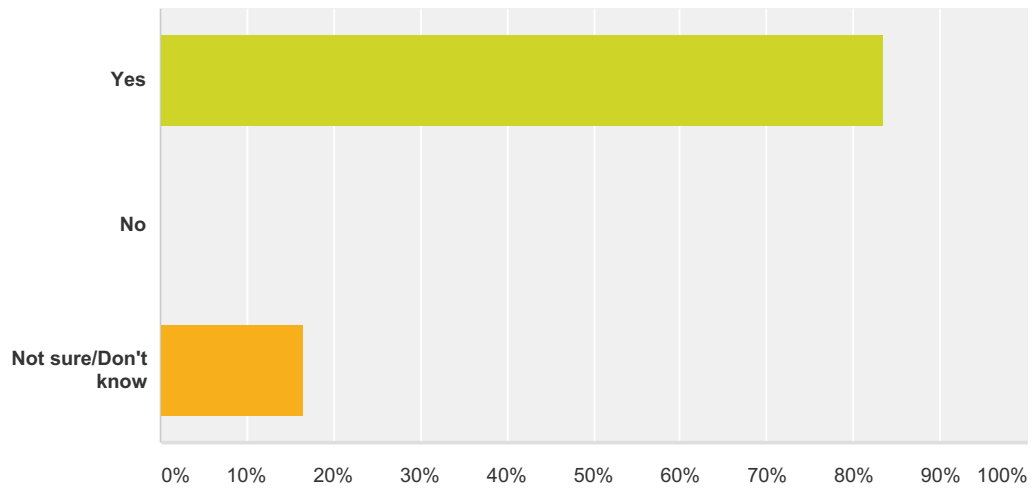

Q8 Do you consider the SERVE Volunteer Programme good value for money?

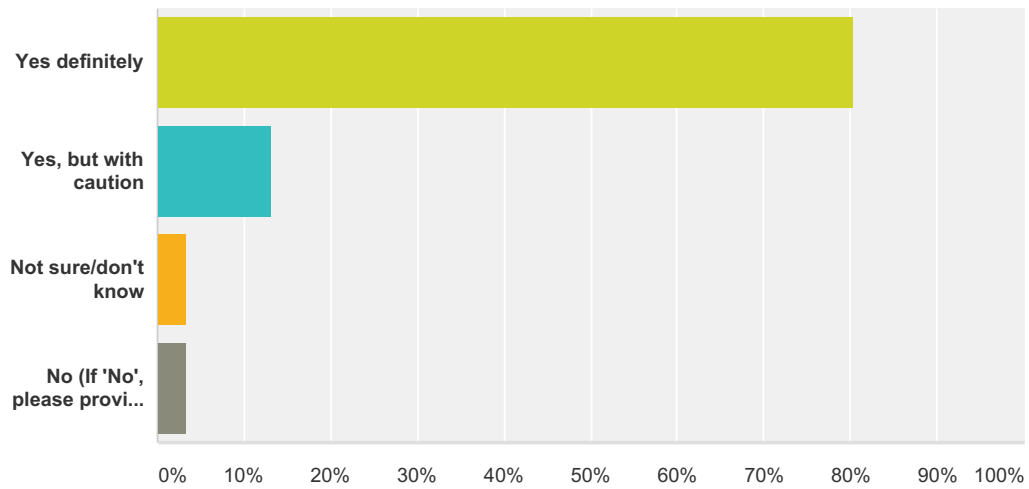

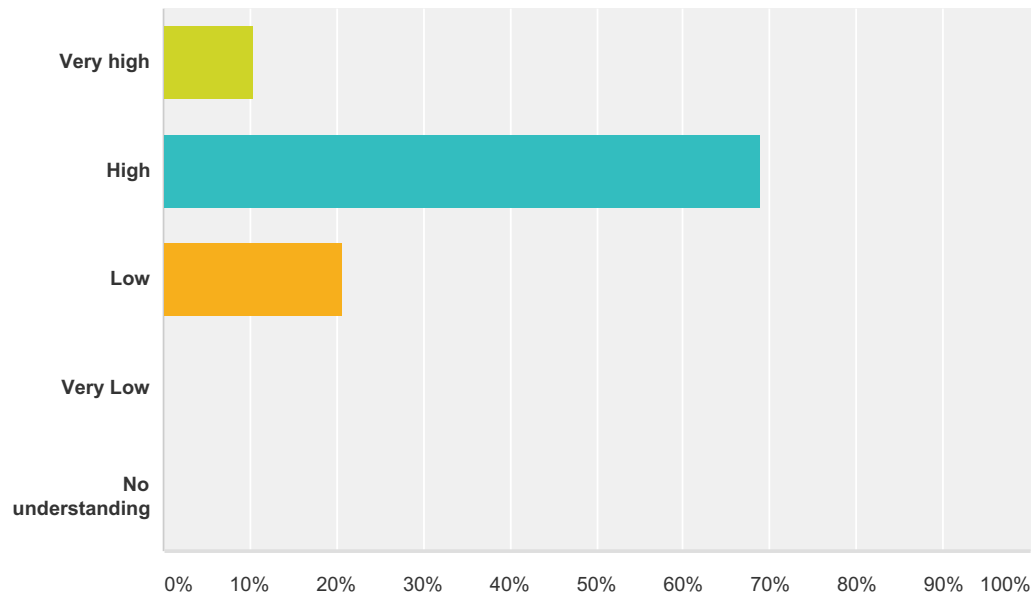

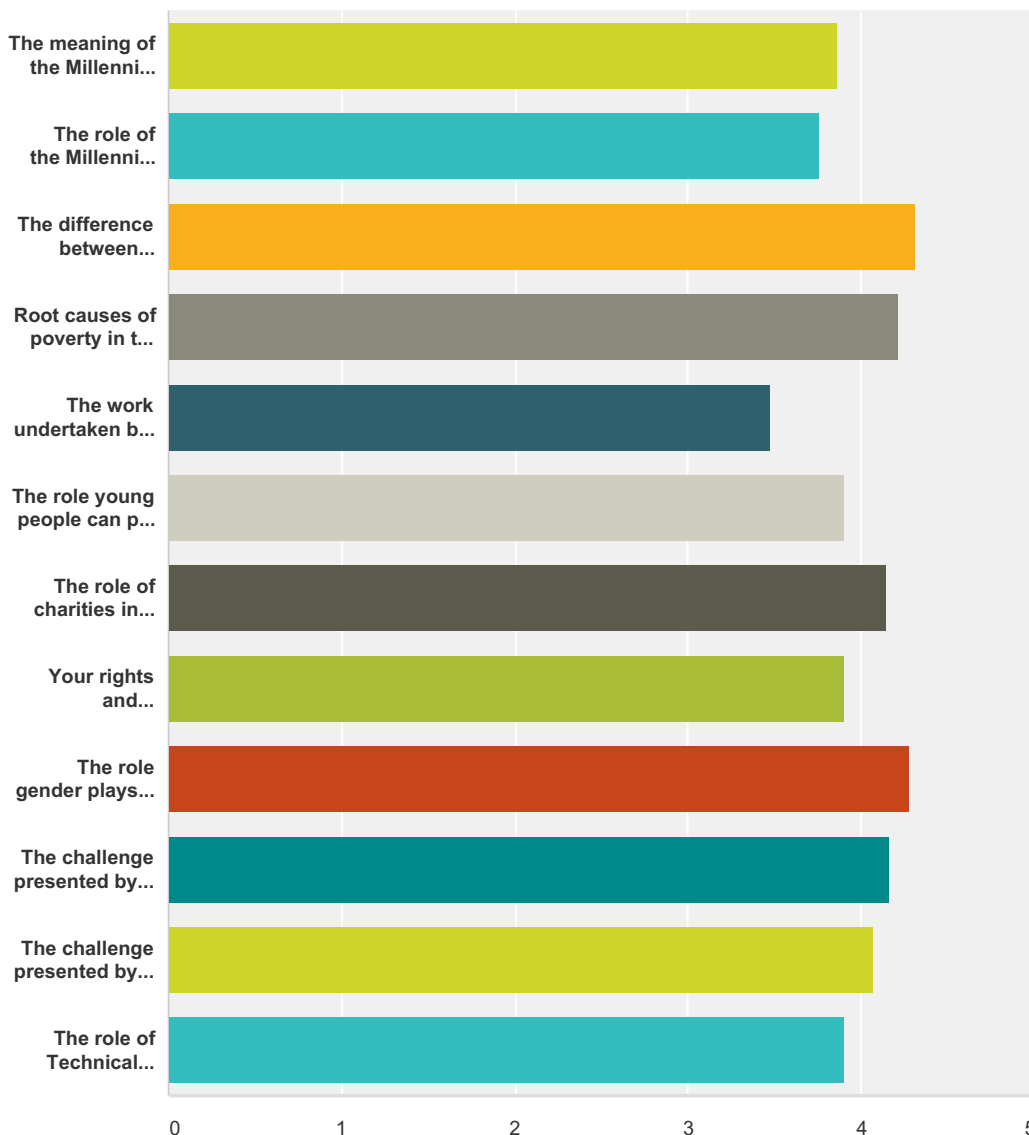

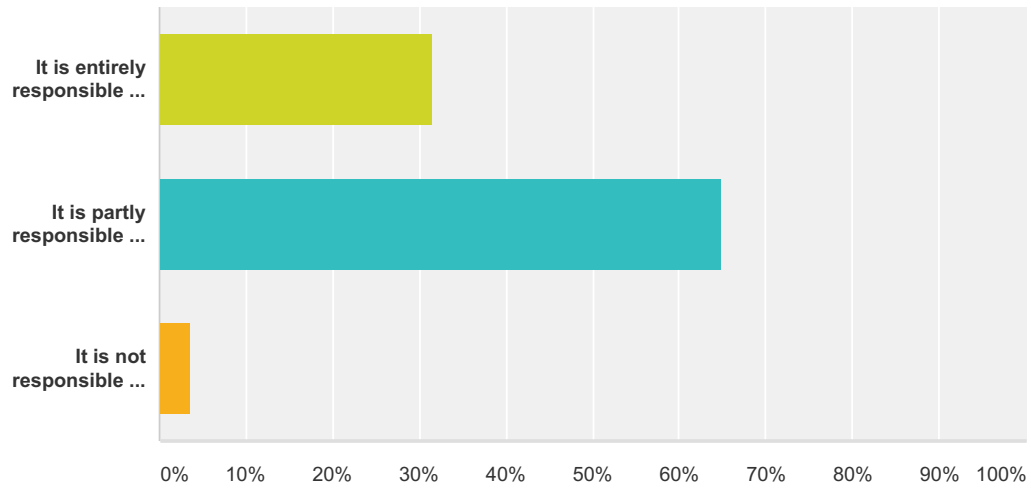

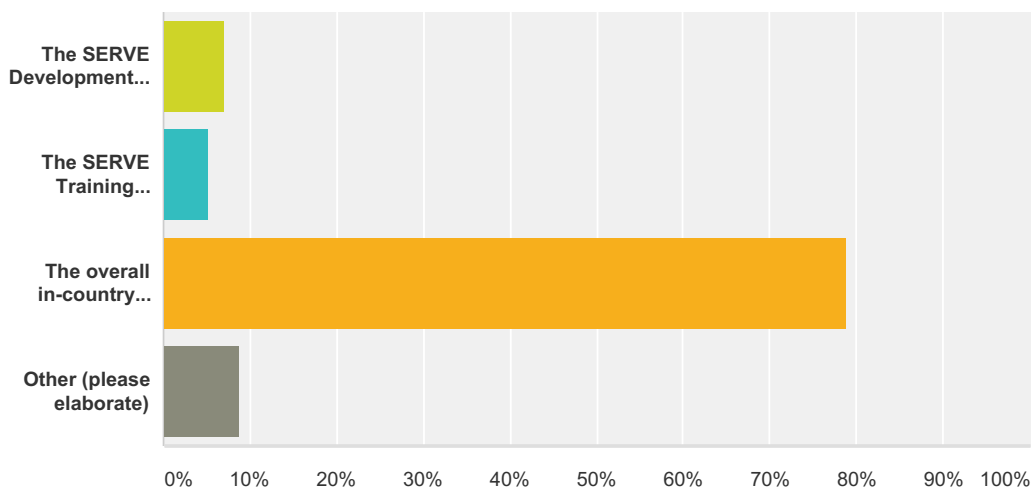

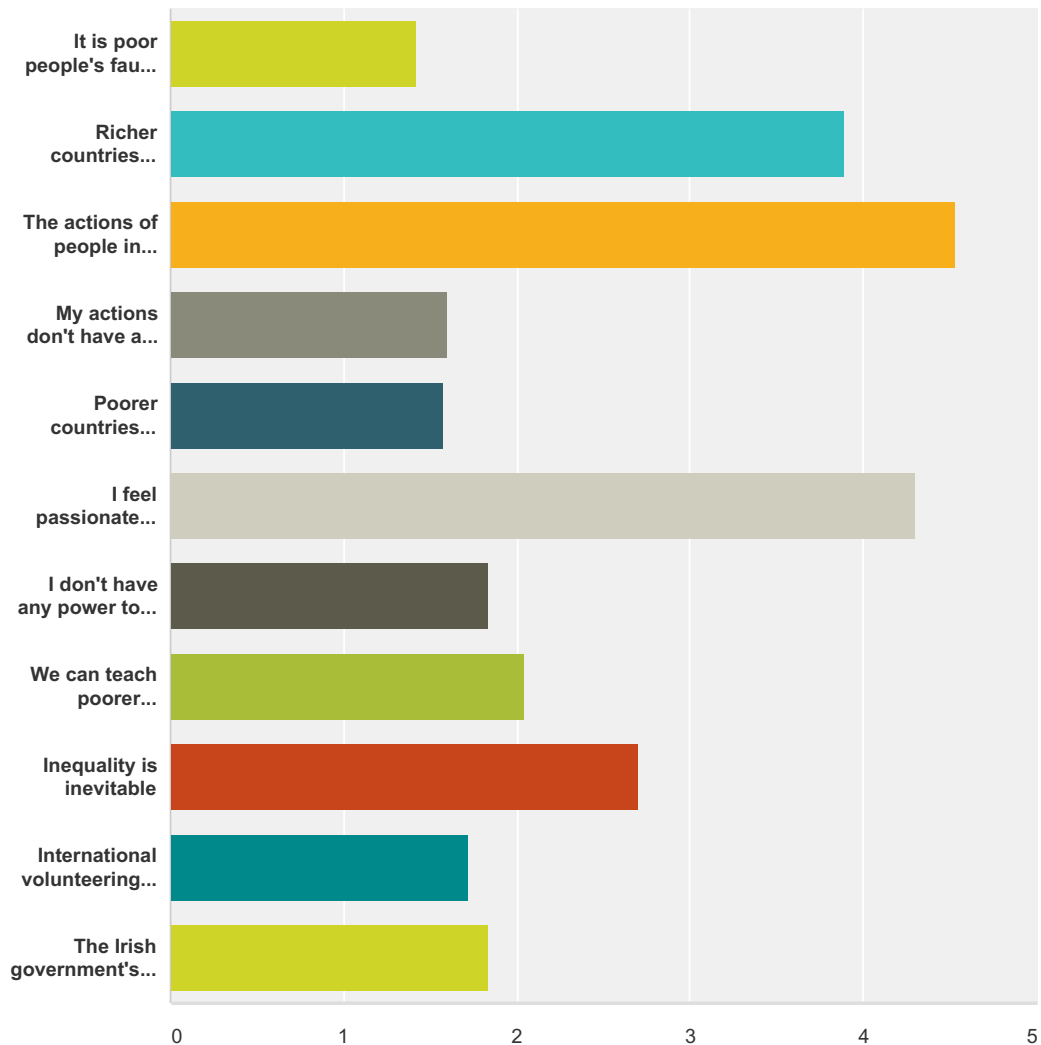

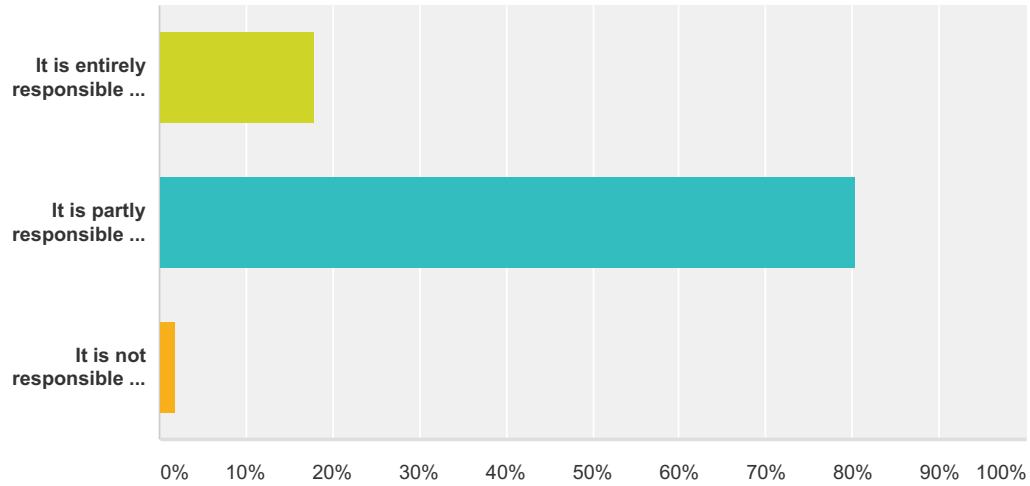

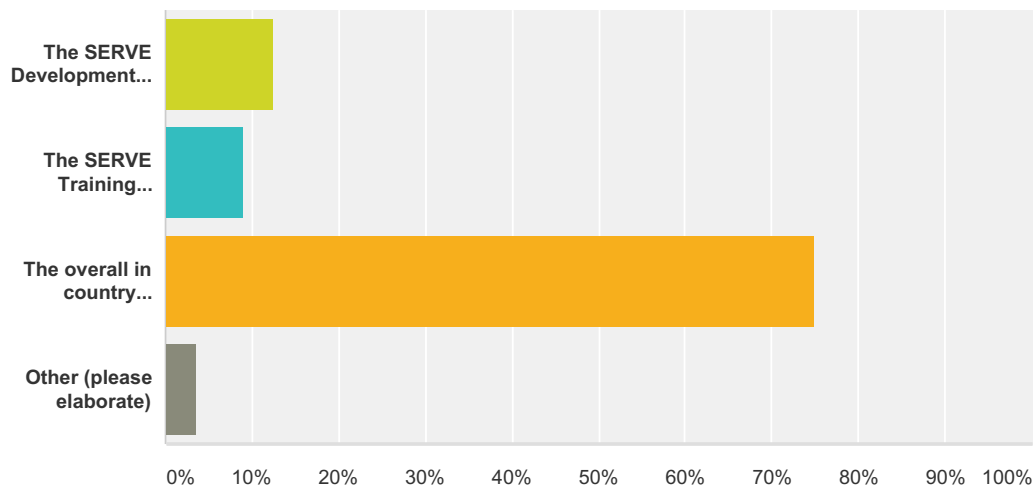

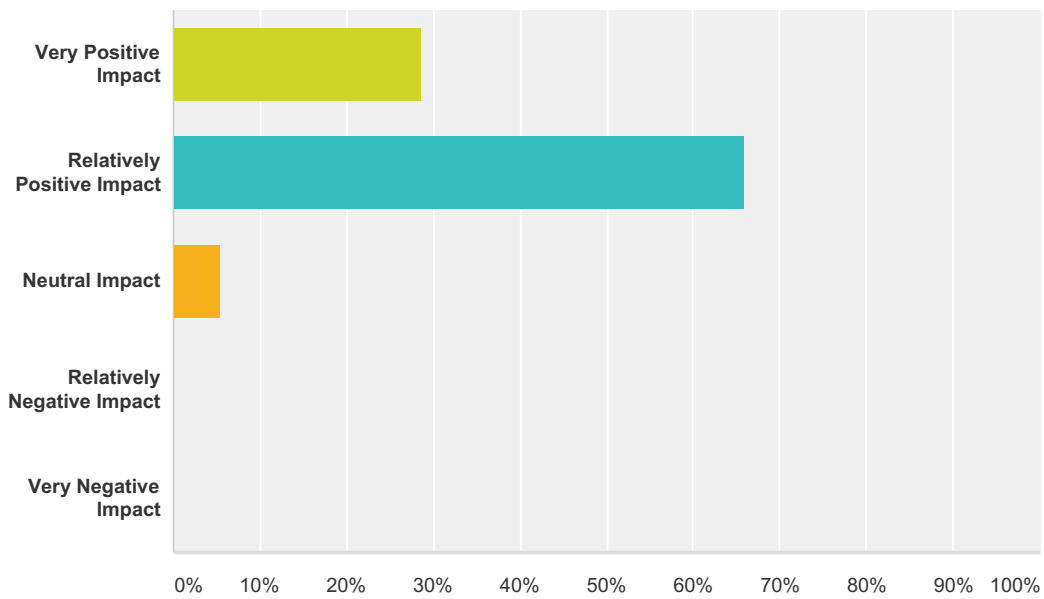

Q17 What impact do you believe your work had on the partner/communities you worked with?

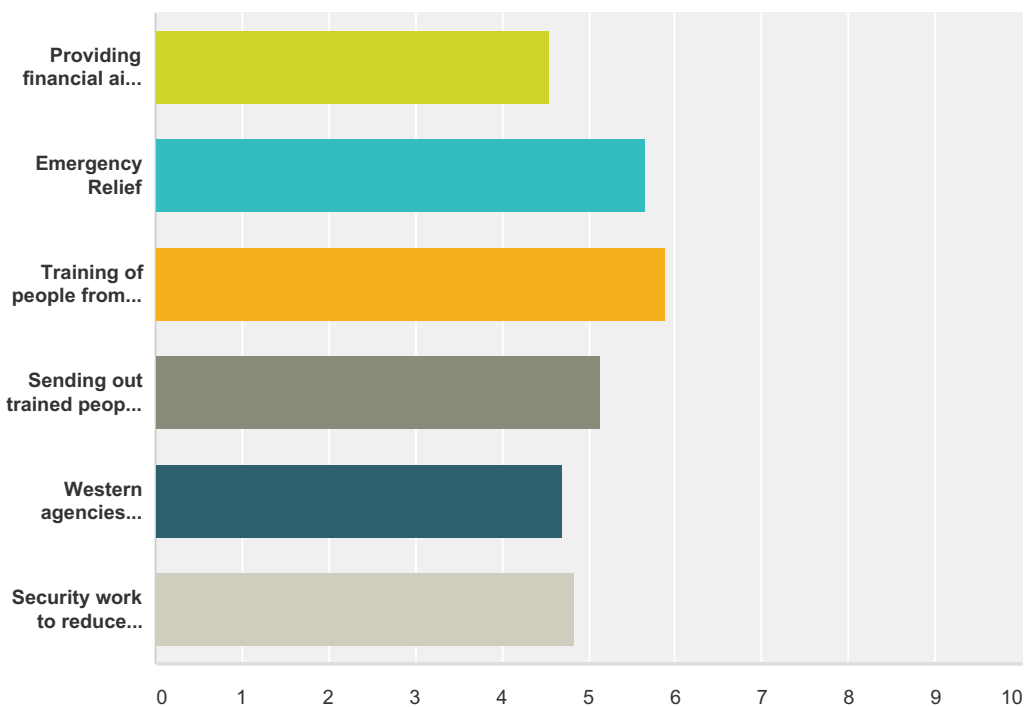

Q18 How important or unimportant would you rate each of the following forms of assistance provided to countries of the Developing World to overcome the challenges they face?

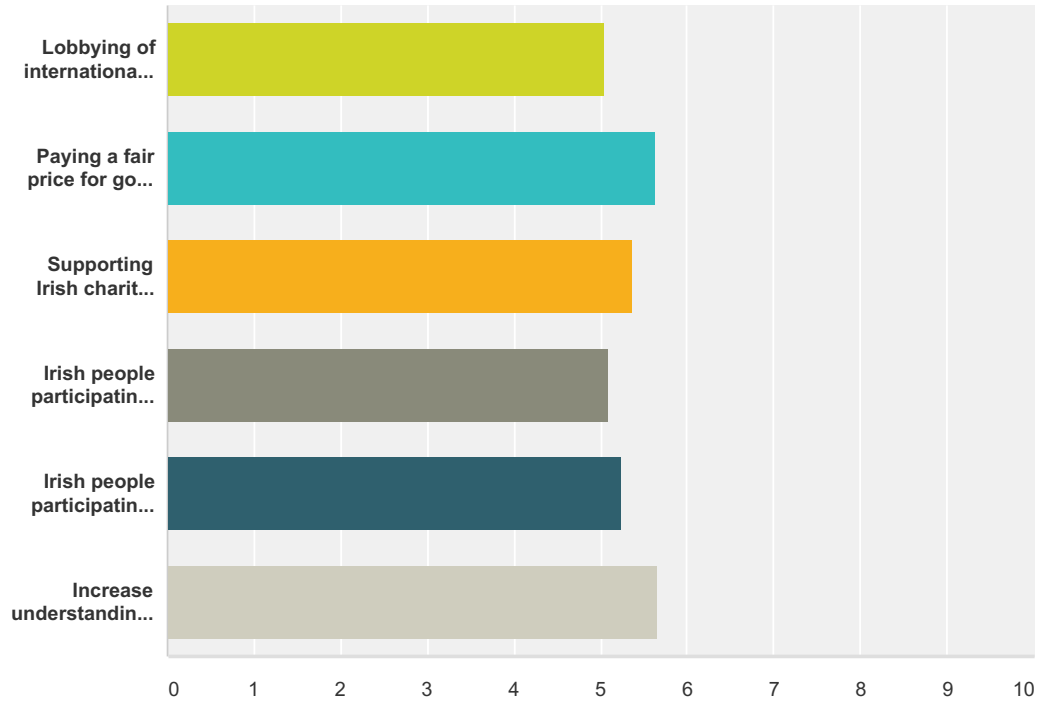

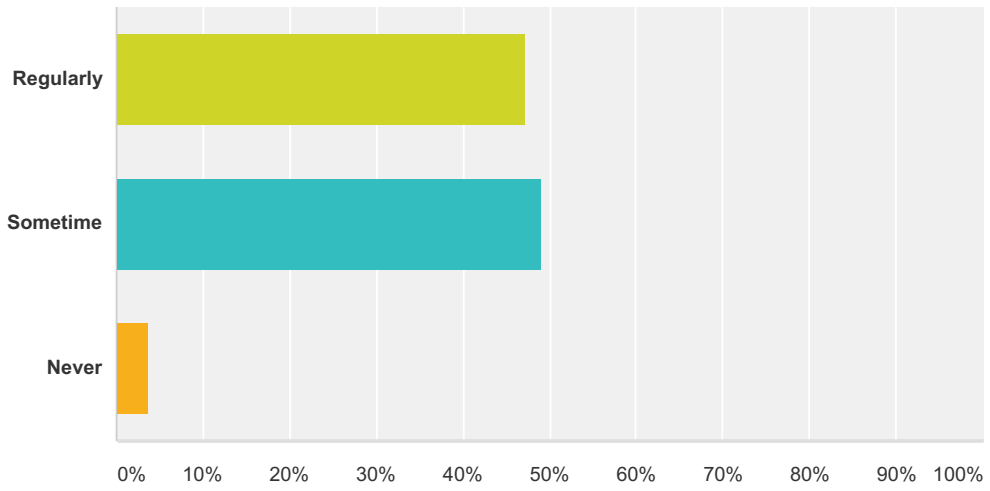

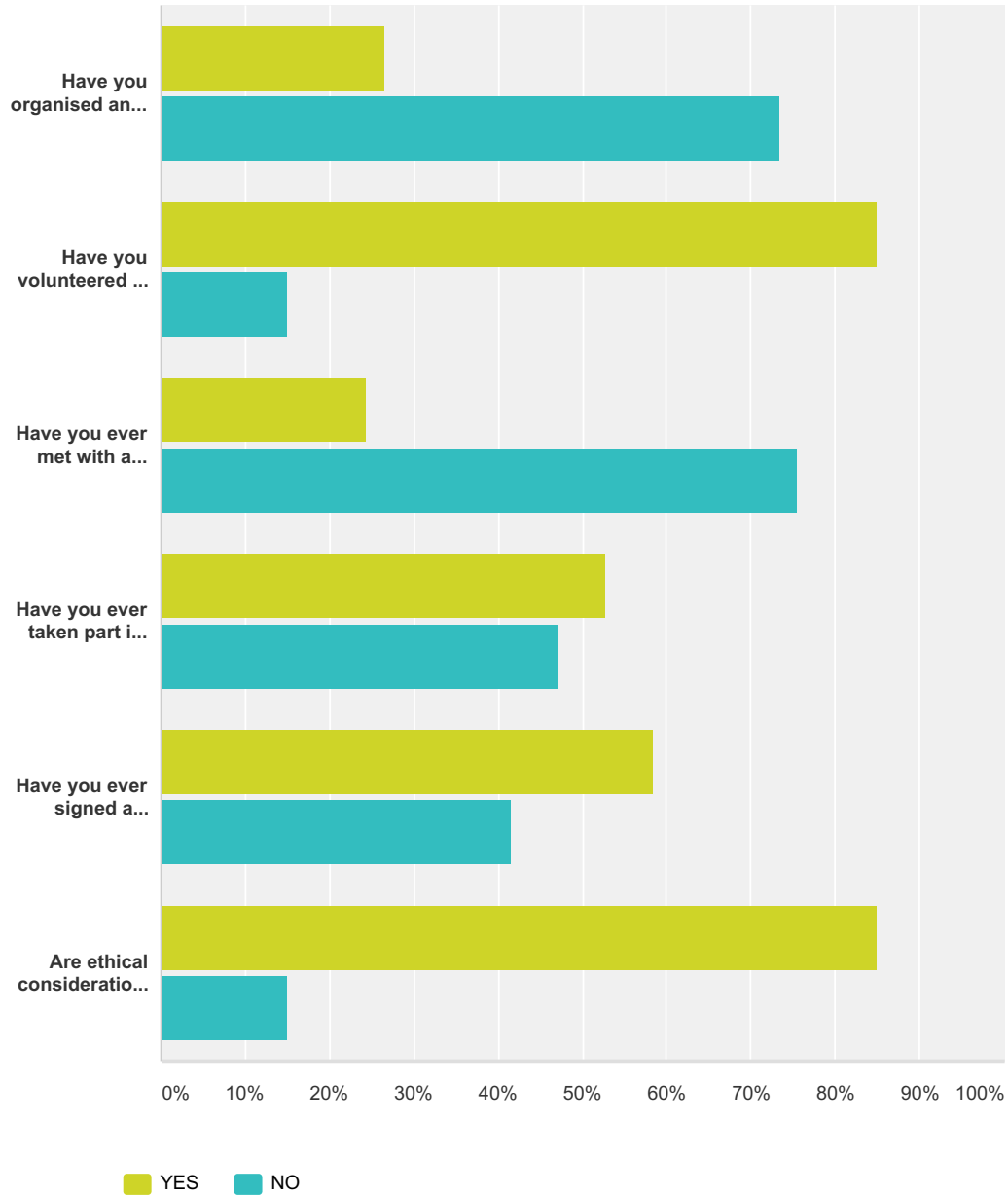

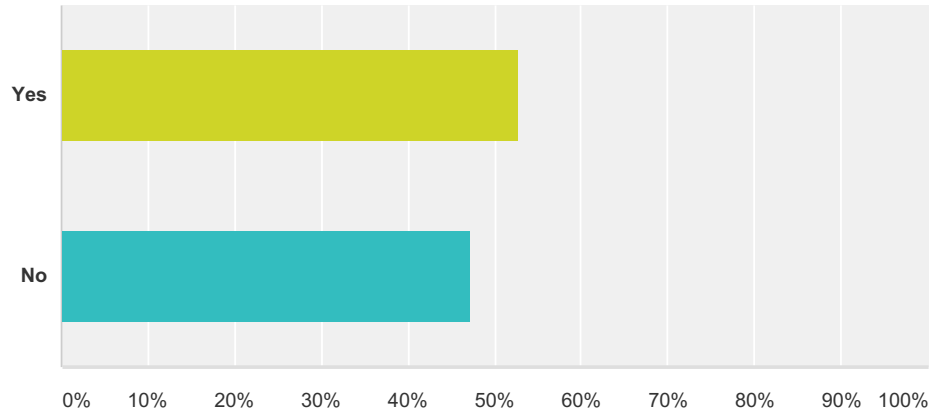

Q23 Was your involvement voluntary or professional?

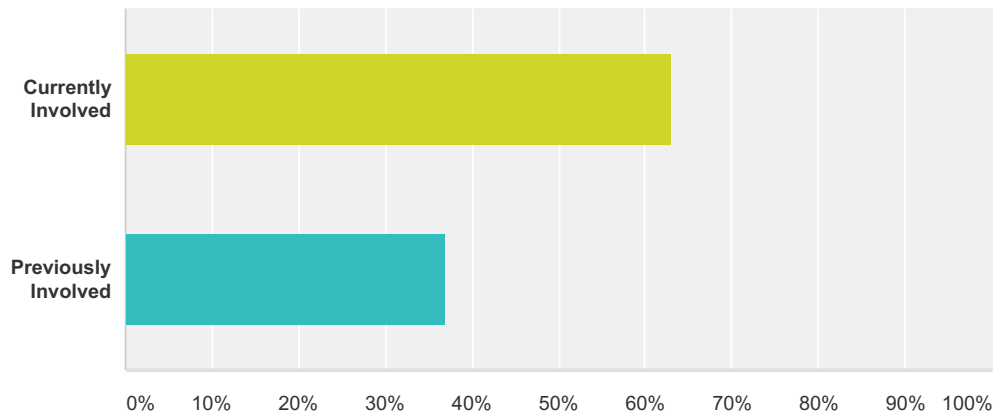

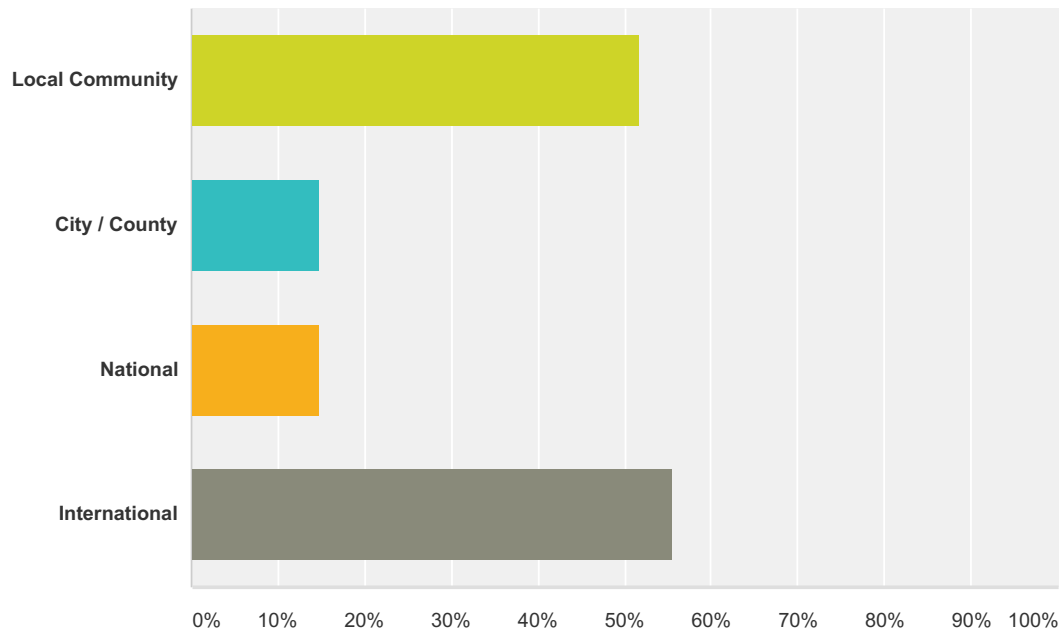

Q27 At what level or levels does the group(s) work at?

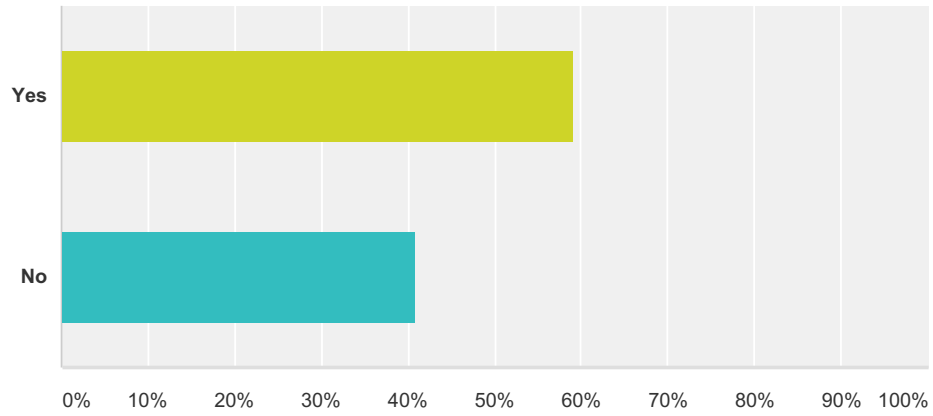

Q28 Do you contribute financially to a development organisation (please exclude fundraising you will be doing/or have done for SERVE as part of your volunteer placement)?

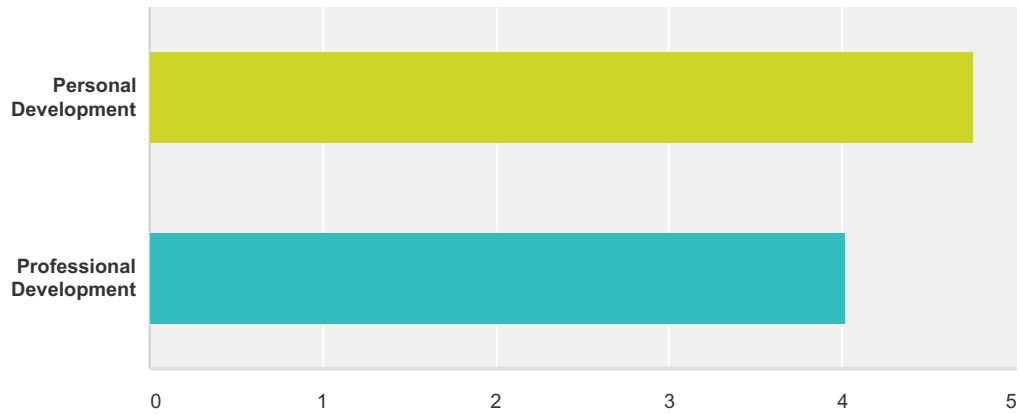

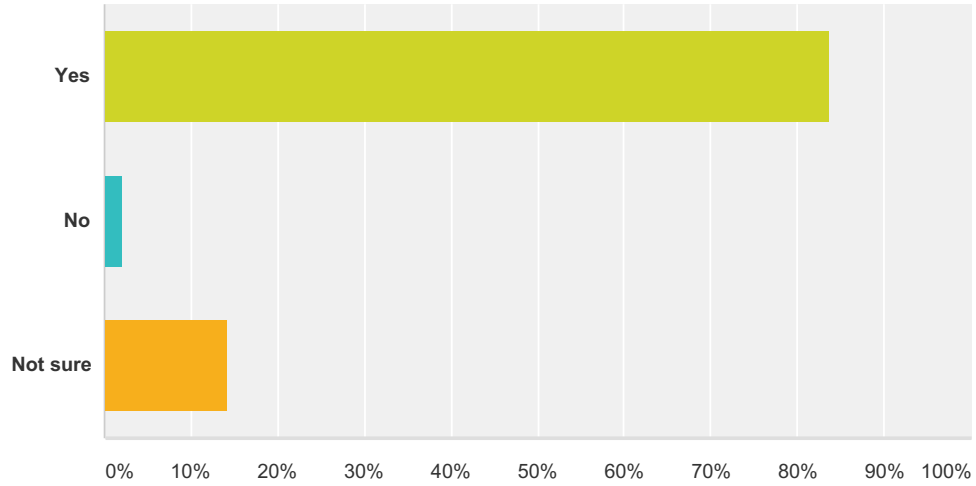

Q33 Would you say that you think critically about development issues? (For example, do you question and critique attitudes to/stories about development you may come across in the media, education and employment?)

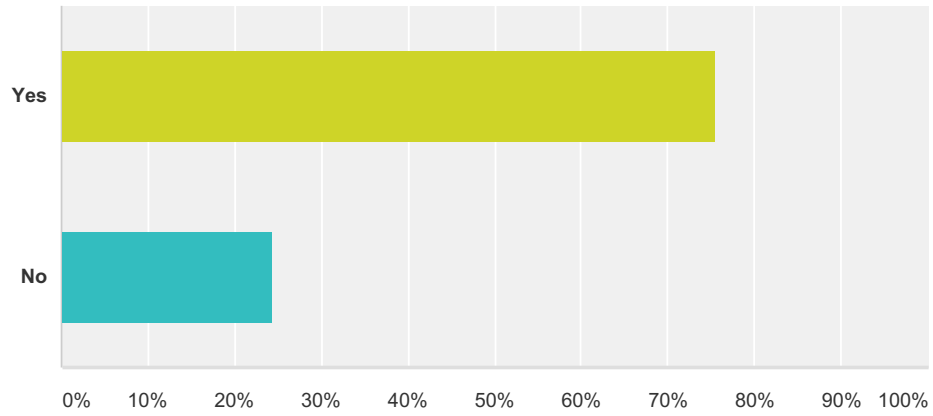
